In Mathematics...

We will develop our skills and knowledge of fractions, including: finding equivalent fractions; comparing fractions; adding and subtracting fractions and mixed numbers; multiplying and dividing fractions; finding fractions of amounts.

Use and interpret metric and imperial units of measure.



In Science...

We will explore electricity; associate brightness of bulb with the voltage of cells. Compare and give reasons when investigating and use symbols to create a circuit diagram.
