In Mathematics...

Become confident reciting numbers to 5

Talk about 2D and 3D shapes

Show 'finger numbers to 5'

Link numerals to amounts

Experiment with own symbols

Solve real life problems to 5

Literacy

Daily NELI-N sessions

Start to write some letters of their name

Write some other letters accurately

Develop phonetical awareness, spotting rhymes, counting syllables, recognise words with initial sounds.

In phonics...

Children to take part in daily Monster Phonics sessions that focus on Phase 1 phonics.

Start to introduce phase 2 – if children are ready

PSE Development

Develop knowledge of different resources and how to use them, show respect and responsibility for things, develop friendships, become familiar with adults in the setting, become more out-going in social situations.

Communication and Language

Enjoy listening to longer stories and remember what has happened, use a wider range of vocabulary, understand a question with two-part, sing a repertoire of songs, develop their communication skills.

Support all children using WELLCOMM

Understanding the World

Talk about what they see, show interest in different occupations, explore how things work.

Expressive Arts and Design

Take part in pretend play, develop complex stories using small world equipment, explore materials freely, create closed shapes, draw with increasing complexity, listen carefully to sounds, explore colour and colour mixing, sing and create own songs.

Home learning

Use Evidence Me regularly
Complete weekly reading and homework

Physical Development

In PE we will develop a range of skills through different EYFS friendly themes.

Continue to develop children's skills to climb, hop, skip, mark make, share and take turns, start to take turns, carry out a task safely and begin to use a knife and fork.

We will also plan a range of activities to develop children's fine motor skills.
